

Laity Sunday Testimonial—Terry Plank

I'm Terry Plank from the Gilmanton United Methodist Church. I serve as the Council Chair for our church as well as holding several other positions. Outside of church, I farm with my brother just outside of Gilmanton.

If someone would have told me 30 years ago that I would become as active in the church as I am today, I never would have believed them. I grew up going to church nearly every Sunday with my family. Once I was living on my own, however, I didn't attend services as often and eventually went some time without going at all. My reasoning for this was that

mornings on a farm are busy and quite frankly I didn't want to put forth the extra effort to get done to make it to Sunday service. After a time, things changed on our farm and my mornings were more flexible and less demanding. I eventually started attending Sunday services again.
