PASTOR'S CORNER

When the new year comes, people make New Year's Resolutions, hoping to have a meaningful year. In a survey asking about New Year's resolutions, conducted by Lifeway Research at the end of 2021, people answered in the order of health, restoration of relationship with God, and finances. It seems that many people have become more interested in God while having a difficult time of corona pandemic. What wishes do you have for the new year?

When I served the Korean church, at the end and the beginning of the year, I encouraged church members to read the entire Bible within a year. One member who started attending the church four years ago said that she had been going to church for a long time but had barely read the Bible. She found a Bible reading chart on the information desk at the church and started reading the Bible using the chart. She is currently reading the Bible for the fourth time. As she read the Bible, she met Jesus personally and began to see the world from a biblical perspective.

For Christians, reading the Bible is the most important foundation along with prayer. When we start reading the Bible, we will know the joy of walking with Jesus, the Word, and live the abundant life that God has promised. The reasons and benefits of reading the Bible can be found in 2 Timothy 3:16-17 and John 20:31.

¹⁶All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷so that the person of God may be proficient, equipped for every good work (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

But these are written so that you may continue to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name (John 20:31).

Since the Bible is the word of God, we must pray for the help of the Holy Spirit when we read it. Therefore, pray like this: "Open my eyes, so that I may behold wondrous things out of your law" (Psalm 119:18). We should also encourage each other and start reading the Bible. If we read four chapters every day, we can read the entire Bible in one year. Following the plan alone may be difficult but if we go together, we can strengthen one another. I hope you have a blessed new year that each one of you and our church communities enjoy intimacy with God through Bible reading.

"DO SOMETHING"

The old saying, "It's easier said than done" runs through my mind from time to time. It's easy to say something and then not follow through on what you just said. It's even easier to just do nothing. A few years ago I was asked by my doctor if there was something I could do to try to lower my cholesterol levels. I immediately thought of two things that I could do. As a result, I've been working on those two things; and my levels have been declining.

As the finance chairperson, I am tasked with oversight of the church's financial status and informing the members of that status. Like any organization, we have an annual budget that we come up with. That's not the hard part. The hard part is finding the money to support that budget. Here's what I can tell you:

- 1. Our budget for 2023 is \$156,749.
- 2. Gilmanton UMC's share is \$18,645.
- 3. That brings Mondovi UMC's net budget down to \$138,104.
- 4. Divided by 12 months of the year, we need an average of \$11,508 or divided by 52 weeks, we need an average of \$2,655 to meet our budget.
- 5. We have about 180 members on our church roll.
- 6. If we divided our weekly needs (\$2,655) by our members (180), we come up with \$14.75 per week per member.
- 7. Let's divided our weekly needs by a different number of members, say 120. That brings us up to \$22.13 per week per member.
- 8. Our weekly giving is nowhere close to \$2,655; therefore, it is getting harder and harder to pay our bills.

I have always been a big believer in being a good role model—to our children and the people I have had the pleasure of working with and supervising. Like my cholesterol levels, there are many ways that I can personally "do something" to help with our budgetary needs. Maybe instead of stopping at Acoustic Café for that cup of coffee and scone, I'll just pack my own coffee in my thermos and bypass the treat. Maybe instead of going out to the Friday night fish fry, I can make a home-cooked meal. The list is infinite!

So my challenge to you is this: Consider "doing something" to help meet our weekly financial needs and keep our church doors open. I pray that you will. I also pray that as you do this, God will bless you back many times. "Our God is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all we ask or think." — Ephesians 3:20
